PROGRAMS

CLIENT CHOICE FOOD PANTRY

Unique to the industry, clients can choose their grocery items from a large variety of food, toiletries, and cleaning supplies.

Over 145 tons of food was distributed in 2023. Emergency food is available for walk in's, a months worth of supplies is provided same day.

HOLIDAY MEALS

Our Holiday meal distribution consists of groceries, choice of Ham, Turkey, or gift card for designated spring, fall and winter holidays. Meals were distributed to 385 families in 2023 equaling the value of \$22.750.00.

ADOPT A FAMILY

In 2023, 79 Families qualified for the December holiday program leading to many smiles, valued at \$10,555.

BACK TO SCHOOL

We provided backpacks full of hand picked school supplies per the grade level, valued at \$1600.00

BIRTHDAY BAG

Our birthday bag program provides a "birthday party in a bag" for children with cake mix, frosting, decorations, party hats and more, valued at \$1080.00

CLOTHING & HOUSEHOLD VOUCHERS

Open Door provides vouchers through our Thrift Store to Low-income families or individuals in need to receive gently used, in-season clothing, coats, shoes, and household items at no cost., valued at \$39,200.



CRISIS FUNDING


Crisis funds are distributed to qualifying individuals for utility bills, car repairs, rent, and more. Client Services Dept. gives out brand new socks, pajamas, winter coats, gloves, and more to clients in need. Crisis Funds, Clothing & Household Vouchers, as well as New clothing passed out to individuals in 2023 had a value of \$82,364.

REFERRALS

Open Door Outreach Center provides referral services to our partners in our community for housing, medical coverage, food assistance and more.

We collaborate with other nonprofits, churches and agencies to provide support, help and guidance to resources available in our community.

REVENUE



WHAT'S NEXT?

Spring of 2024 is the opening of our Open Door Outreach Life Skills Resource Center (LSRC). The LSRC is a three year project accomplished with help from grants from GM and our dedicated community. The LSRC will provide additional services and continue to evolve to meet the needs of our community.

OUR FUTURE

In March of 2019 ODOC paid off the mortgage on our administration building, which at the time housed our Food Pantry. In the beginning of 2020, our lease was expiring on our Thrift Store, and our Food Pantry needed more space. Not knowing the pandemic was in the near, we began negotiations to purchase our storefront along with the adjoining suites to build a new Food Pantry, Client Services, expand the Thrift Store footprint, and finally build the Life Skills Resource Center. We arrived at a 6 year land contract to own the space, at a monthly cost that was effectively cash neutral to our operating budget. Then the pandemic hit.

In late 2023 despite the pandemic, we finished all of our expansion plans. To continue to meet the increase in demand for our community, *We will be looking in the near future to host a "Burst the Balloon" Capital Campaign, to help us assuage the balloon payment due on our land contract in less than 2 years, and to set us up for success in the coming decade.*
